COURSE INFORMATION

OVERVIEW: Sickle cell disease is a devastating chronic illness that can be disabling and life-limiting. Research has demonstrated that frequency of pain crises, hospitalizations, and complications from this disease can be minimized with optimal adherence to disease-modifying medications and regular medical follow-up. This conference will educate health care professionals on strategies and skills that can improve patient adherence to medications, medical follow-up appointments and the sickle cell plan of care.

TARGET AUDIENCE: This course is intended for practicing physicians, nurses, social workers, health care professionals and students who care for patients with sickle cell disease.

OBJECTIVES: After attending this conference, participants will be able to 1.) Recognize the complex factors affecting adherence of the sickle cell plan of care; 2.) Integrate effective communication skills and strategies that will improve patient adherence to the sickle cell plan of care; and 3.) Apply best practices and resources to educate sickle cell patients within one's own clinical practice.
